## **RESOLUTION 202122-01**

TO:	Members of the Student Senate

SUBJECT:	Condemning the Requirement for Use of Prison Labor

## ACTION REQUESTED

Recognizing and condemning, in the strongest possible terms, both the use of prison labor for items purchased by SUNY Cortland, and Corcraft's status as a preferred source under NYS Finance Law §162 and NYS State Corrections Law §184.

## RESOLUTION

I recommend that the Senate of the SUNY Cortland Student Government Association adopt the following resolution:

<u>Whereas</u>, in the 2020-2021 fiscal year SUNY Cortland spent \$307,554.57<sup>1</sup> on products from Corcraft; and

<u>Whereas</u>, Corcraft is a preferred source according to NYS Finance Law §162 and NYS State Corrections Law §184; and,

<u>Whereas</u>, SUNY Cortland is required by law to consider the use of preferred sources for any purchase of a commodity or service; and,

- <u>Whereas</u>, Corcraft is the so-called "brand name" of the Division of Correctional Industries; and,
- <u>Whereas</u>, incarceration disproportionately affects Black, Indigenous, and people of color at rates of 1.4 to more than 9 times as much as their white counterparts<sup>2</sup>; and,

- <u>Whereas</u>, Corcraft pays its incarcerated workers sub-minimum wages, as low as twenty-six cents per hour<sup>3</sup>; therefore be it,
- <u>Resolved</u>, that the Senate acknowledges the use of prison labor for the manufacturing of products purchased by SUNY Cortland; and be it,
- <u>Resolved</u>, that the Senate condemns in the strongest possible terms the continued use of Corcraft as a preferred source by the state of New York.
