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
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STUDENT SPOTLIGHT

This month, we're excited to feature Alexa Timo, a SUNY Cortland student studying abroad at Universidad de Salamanca in Spain. Alexa, double-majoring in International Studies and Communication Studies, has fully embraced her time in Spain, from overcoming the language barrier to exploring the culture and traveling across Europe.

COLOMBIA: ECOLOGIES, ECONOMIES, AND CULTURE WITH DR. BEN WILSON

Dr. Ben Wilson and Dr. Kelly Wessell's study abroad program in Colombia this summer offers students a unique opportunity to explore the connections between environment, culture, and economy in one of the world's most biodiverse countries. The program combines ecological, cultural, and economic studies with a focus on sustainability, giving students the chance to see these concepts in action through fieldwork and hands-on learning.



The trip takes students through three diverse regions: the biodiverse Quindío, the indigenous cultures of the Amazon, and the Caribbean coast, with a stop in Medellín to explore how the city transformed into one of Latin America's most livable places. The program's interdisciplinary approach makes it stand out, with students learning about coffee culture and eco-tourism in Quindío, sustainable practices in the Amazon, and comparing tourism development in the Caribbean. In Medellín, students will explore the role of education, public art, and democratic investment in the city's transformation, gaining a deeper understanding of how community-driven development can bring lasting change.

The course, ECO 329, is open to students from all majors and focuses on real-world applications of sustainability-related economic theories. Students will explore how ecotourism supports local economies and conserves ecosystems while gaining hands-on experiences, like working with local artisans and learning traditional food systems. These experiences provide students with valuable insights into how economies, cultures, and environments are deeply interconnected.



Dr. Wilson and Dr. Wessell hope students will leave with a deeper appreciation for cultural and environmental sustainability and the role it plays in economic development. They believe the trip provides a transformative experience that challenges students to think critically about global sustainability issues and how they can contribute to positive change. The program encourages students to keep an open mind, pack light, and be ready for an unforgettable adventure. Whether it's your first international trip or you're a seasoned traveler, this experience offers a rare chance to immerse yourself in new perspectives and explore real-world solutions to global challenges.


