With a focus on Social Studies and History, Amanda chose this program to gain a new perspective on historical studies while fitting into her academic schedule without missing a semester.

Arrival and Initial Impressions

"The views on the way to Cork were incredible and really set the tone for my month there," she reflects. 


BELIZE: HISTORY, ART, AND CULTURE WITH PROFESSOR JEREMIAH DONOVAN

Professor Jeremiah Donovan's Belize Study Abroad Program offers SUNY Cortland students an immersive journey into Maya history and contemporary Belizean culture. Launched in 2013, the program, "Belize Study Abroad: History, Art, and Culture," invites students to explore Belize's rich heritage and vibrant community.

Based at the Chaa Creek Rainforest Retreat along the Macal River, the program includes excursions to ancient Maya sites and snorkeling in the Barrier Reef on Caye Caulker. Donovan emphasizes, "We selected these locations for the authentic rural setting in order to experience the true culture of Belize."

As the program facilitator, Donovan provides students with deep cultural engagement, drawing on his extensive experience with international programs. "I serve as a facilitator for students to experience a unique cultural immersion that has time and again proven to be life-changing," he explains.



A significant aspect of the program is the interaction with the Maya community in San Antonio. Donovan recalls, "On my first visit, I was introduced to a Maya family of potters in a remote village of San Antonio. It was then that I recognized the opportunities this experience would create for students in any major."

The program's interdisciplinary approach connects students with Belize's history, art, and culture through diverse activities. Students also navigate challenges like adjusting to a new environment and confronting poverty, supported by nightly reflection sessions. As one student noted, "This trip proved to be life-changing and opened my eyes to issues and causes in the world that are far greater than the everyday problems in my own life."

There's still time to join this winter's Belize program. Interested students should book an appointment with the International Programs Office to begin the process and secure their spot for an unforgettable experience in Belize.
